On Thursday 8 December there will be a STOP WORK MEETING for all teachers across the state. The meeting unfortunately overlaps partly with our Yr 3-6 Presentation Assembly. THE 3-6 PRESENTATION ASSEMBLY WILL GO AHEAD AS SCHEDULED, however, there will be MINIMAL SUPERVISION FOR K-2. Classes for K-2 children will begin at 9:45am.

Why is it important to distinguish between a <u>strike</u> and a <u>stop work meeting</u>? A strike occurs when there is a dispute between the employee and the employer, which is not the case in this situation. This meeting is about the negotiation of our new three year salaries award. The last time teachers stopped work was three years ago for the same reason. We don't like missing school either, but this is important.

Why can't the meeting be held outside school hours? It is standard practice in all fields when negotiating a salaries and conditions contract that it be done in working hours; and also, trying to organise 60,000 employees to meet at one time is a VERY BIG JOB.








SCHOOLS SPECTACULAR 2016
