### Year 2 Swimming and Water Safety Program

Year 2 students are currently participating in a ten day swimming program at the Andrew Charlton Swim Centre at Manly. The Swimming and Water Safety Program is supported by the Department of Education and equips students with water safety and survival skills.

On the first day students were assessed and placed into four groups depending on their swimming ability. Each day the students work through a series of activities to develop their water safety skills and improve their swimming technique. At the completion of the program each student will receive a certificate outlining their water safety skills and swimming capabilities.

The students have thoroughly enjoyed the program and it has helped to develop their water confidence, water survival and swimming skills. All Year 2 students are to be commended for their model behaviour at the pool.
