## Parent Interviews

## Parents collecting children procedures

The school is always determined to provide the safest possible environment for our students. Consequently we have streamlined a number of procedures with regard to early and late departures. As has always been the case, we remind parents to always come to the school office to sign in any late children & always come to the office when arriving to pick up students early.

**We do ask that parents ensure that students arrive at school every day on time. It is frustrating, time consuming and disruptive when students regularly arrive late for no apparent reason. The children can feel uncomfortable and singled out as they enter their room when the class has already begun their lesson, had the instructions carefully explained or have trouble locating the class as they are at yoga, sport, library etc. Similarly, in the afternoon more and more children are leaving early to accommodate appointments, specialist activities or early departures for holidays.**

**After talking with my principal colleagues, I know this has become a far more common problem of late in our schools. In some high schools such absences are not accepted.**

**Could I please ask that parents do carefully consider the scheduling of activities and endeavour to be at school each and every day on time and until the end of the day. Your support in this matter is greatly appreciated.**

## Tell Them From Me student feedback survey (Term 1, 2019)

This term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The survey is a great opportunity for our Year 4,5 and 6 students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

Please be assured that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours by the end of Term 1. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey will be emailed to parents of students in Years 4, 5 and 6 this week. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by 25 March 2019.

### Understanding fears and worries in children

Professor Jennie Hudson is the Director of the Centre for Emotional Health within the Department of Psychology, Macquarie University. Jennie's research focuses on understanding the factors that contribute to children's emotional health and working to improve the services available to children experiencing anxiety and other emotional disorders. She is an author of the internationally renowned Cool Kids program, an evidence-based program for managing anxiety problems in children and young people.

Jennie's presentation will provide parents with information on anxiety problems in primary school aged children. She will discuss how to know if your child's fears and worries are normal, when to seek help, and what strategies you can put in place to set them on the right track.

## YOGA & WELLBEING

### Consolidation

Next week students in Years 3–6 finish their Life Skills Group program. In their session this week, students learnt about gratitude. They were excited to recreate their favourite movement sequences, construct new ones and perform their sequences for the class to follow. Not only was recreating movements fun, but the exercise allowed students to take on a leadership role in the class and become accountable for their own learning. Together, students revisited what they had learnt during the program and discussed which tools could be applied to their own lives. In particular, they focused on a range of breathing techniques. They express that they felt calm, happy and relaxed after engaging in the various exercises. Students suggested utilising mindful exercises anytime feelings of anxiousness or worry creep in, when having a dispute with a friend or sibling or if having trouble sleeping. Through collaborative team games students worked with partners to put their positive self talk into practice.

**Parent/carer:** Ask your child what they are grateful for each day.

**Family self-care tip:** Start a gratitude jar. Place a post it note a day with one thing you are grateful for. At the end of the month or year, go through and see how many things in life there are to be thankful for. Through the Life Skills Group program students have become increasingly aware of important values such as respect, honesty, empathy, teamwork, compassion and kindness. The students have demonstrated an understanding of body awareness, self awareness, resilience and problem solving skills. Students have been challenged individually and have had opportunities to develop team skills through partner work, group work and class work. They are now equipped with more tools, strategies and experiences to apply when faced with difficult situations or feelings.

The Autumn/Winter season of PSSA will commence in Term 2, Week 2 Friday 10 May. PSSA sport options are offered to all students in Years 3-6. PSSA teams are organised according to age. All Autumn/Winter sport teams have a Junior and Senior team. Junior teams are for children who are 8-10 years old and senior teams are for children who are 11-13 years old. At Wheeler Heights we run our trials in accordance to the Pittwater Zone constitution.

### WHPS PSSA Trial Guidelines:

- Children do not have to participate in this sport out of school to be eligible to try out for the team
- Students pre-register their interest by indicating a preference for two sports only
- The selections will be made according to performance on selection sessions
- Two teachers are present at the trials and make the decision together
- If a child is absent for one of the selection days or away due to other school commitments, please let the school know and we will do our best to make suitable arrangements

When selecting students during trials, consideration will be given to those who display ability, stamina and strong skill level on the days of the trials (Students complete a range of activities that involve demonstrating the skills needed to play that particular sport. It is not about which children know how to play that sport or whether they play it on the weekend or not). Consideration may also be given for those that display:

- Sportsmanship;
- Cooperation and attitude; and
- Commitment to training sessions

Unfortunately some of the popular sports have over 60 students trialling and most teams can only take 10-15 players. Yes, we understand that this means there are students who are disappointed and upset. These decisions are difficult for our teaching staff who volunteer their time and effort in coaching PSSA teams. They do not make these decisions lightly and use their professional judgement to select teams. If your child does not make a PSSA team, please help them learn from the experience and build their resilience...

This year Wheeler Heights is participating in the Interschools Snow Sports Competition.

The Interschools is an organisation running school based snow races for students in Kindergarten to Year 12. Public and Independent schools compete together within their regions. There are three regions within our state (Northern, Southern and Sydney). Wheeler Heights competes in the Northern Region and will contest its Regional Titles during the first week of the July school holidays at Perisher.

Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are encouraged to join in the fun at the Regional Championships.

Students qualifying through their Region can expect to then compete at State and maybe even National level. The Interschools offers the disciplines of Alpine Ski, Skier Cross, Mogul Skiing, Cross-Country Skiing, Snowboard GS and Snowboard Boarder Cross.

The races are divided into divisions as follows:

- Division 4 = Years 5 & 6
- Division 5 = Years 3 & 4
- Division 6 = Kindergarten to Year 2

The Wheeler Heights ski and board program is teacher co-ordinated, requires parent involvement and is funded on a user pays basis. ### Step 2: Add your School and Group/s

Click on the search icon and search for 'Wheeler Heights Public School'

Ensure when you add the communication groups you choose for each child:

- Scholastic Year
- Roll class
- Each extra curricula group e.g. senior dance

If your child is in a PSSA team, choose the individual team e.g. 'girls cricket' AND the group titled 'PSSA'. The individual team group will have specific information regarding that team only, the PSSA group will give information regarding cancelled games/wet weather.

### Step 3: Select NEWSFEED

### Step 4: Add your Flexischools Account

Click the 'Order Now' button located in the bottom right hand corner of the App. This will open up a login screen.

- Already a Flexischools User – enter your details and login.
- New to Flexischools User – Click 'Register', enter your email address and follow the instructions in the email.

### To place an order with canteen or uniform shop

Click on the 'Order Now' button located in the bottom right hand menu of the App.

- Select the items you wish to order.
- Select payment option and complete payment.
