Just a reminder that the Premier's Reading Challenge ends tomorrow. Congratulations to all the students who participated. Certificates will be awarded some time next term.

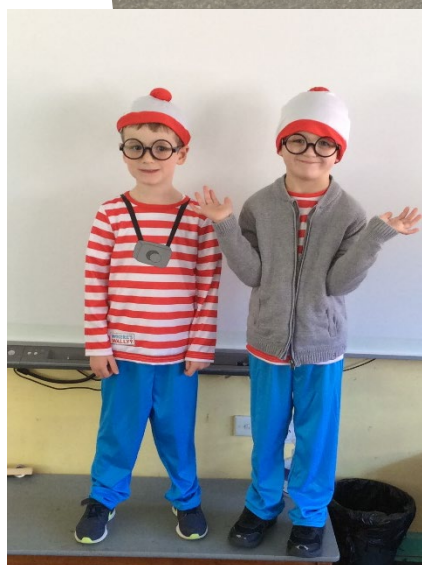
AUTHOR VISIT

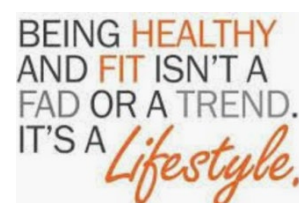
SPORTS UPDATE
