STUDENT LEADERS VISIT TO PARLIAMENT HOUSE

Last Thursday, I was fortunate to accompany three members of our student leadership team to NSW Parliament House in the city. The students were invited, along with their peers from schools across Wakehurst electorate, to a morning tea and tour by our local member, Mr Brad Hazzard. They interacted with students and teachers from other schools, participated in group discussions and all spoke maturely when Mr Hazzard addressed them. Mr Hazzard explained how a bill becomes a law and he answered many questions from students across his electorate about the health care system within NSW. 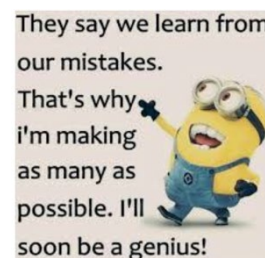

On Thursday 15 August, Wheeler Heights Public School participated in the Run4Fun Colour Explosion Run on our school oval. Organised by the WHPS P&C, this event was enjoyed by students from kindergarten to Year Six, everyone was having lots of fun together. It was a beautiful day, the sun shining brightly and anticipation filled the air. Some Year Six students from 6J helped set up the obstacles and stations, as well as testing out the track for the afternoon. Mr Radom, the school's general assistant contributed greatly to setting up the event for the students as well. There were many exciting obstacles that the students had to run through such as a hurdle run, bouncing through on a bouncing ball, run under a parachute, as well as the balance beams. There were five races in total; Kindergarten and Y6, Y1 and Y2, Y3 and Y4, Y5 and Y6, and finally a parents and toddlers race for any other keen colour run enthusiasts. Whilst the obstacles were fun, most of the students enjoyed the coloured powder. Throughout running the course, the students were sprayed with coloured powder.
