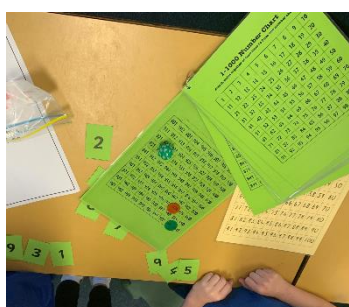

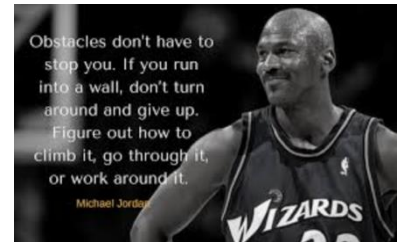

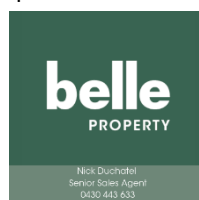


Thanks to all the Dads who came along to our Father's Day Breakfast last Friday.

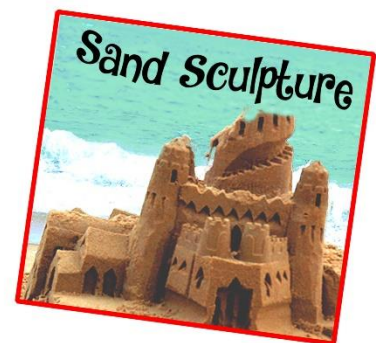
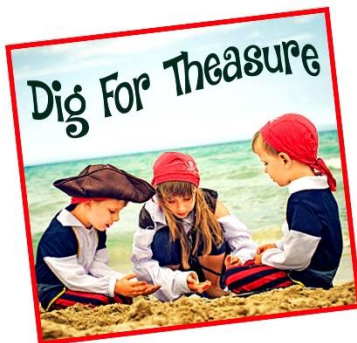
