SPORTS UPDATE

MORNING PSSA from 2020



After much discussion across the PCS schools, the Pittwater PSSA delegates have decided that from 2020, our competition for Summer and Winter will be held in the mornings. This means that our school sports programs will also run during this time.

Summer PSSA will run from Term 1 Weeks 6-8, Term 3 Weeks 9-10 and Term 4 Weeks 1-6. Winter PSSA will run from Term 2 weeks 2-9 (with Week 8 set aside for Sydney North Cross Country) and Term 3 weeks 1-5.

Both competitions will run in the morning from 9:30-10:50am with all students back at school by 11:30am. There are several reasons for this change:

1. Cancer Council recommendations

- Where possible, we schedule outdoor activities outside the peak UV times of 10am – 2pm (11am – 3pm daylight saving time), in the shade or indoors.
- Melanoma is the most common cancer diagnosed in Australians aged 15-29yrs and accounts for more than ¼ of all cancers in this age group.

2. Research shows morning exercise benefits

- Exercise helps trigger endorphins, which improve the prioritising functions of the brain.
- After exercise, your ability to sort out priorities improves, allowing you to block out distractions and better concentrate on the task at hand.
- Improved attention span = more engaged kids
- Morning sport = more active all day long = happy students = happy teachers
