This term our Year 6 students have been organising the Home Sport activities for all students from Years 3-6 on Friday morning. To engender school and house spirit, the Year 6 students and teachers suggested that each house wear a shirt of their respective house colour, red, yellow or green. This has proved to be very popular and successful.







Recently we have been discussing the merits of only having three school houses, as almost all schools usually have four. Also, the Wheeler house name is rather an unusual choice as it is obviously the name of our school.

Consequently, after initial discussion with the students, staff and recently at the P&C meeting, we are proposing that from next year we have four school sport houses. Ramsay and Jenkins would remain and we would instigate two new houses. The two new houses may have an Aboriginal name significant to this particular area of the northern beaches.

Having four houses would provide more leadership opportunities for our Year 6 students and also more chance for students to represent their house by running or swimming in house relay teams. The most obvious difficulty with a change to four houses would mean the re allocation of some students to new houses.
