2. SUSTAINABILITY

ASHLEY HEWES, NICK JONES

- Mr. Ashley Hewes and Mr. Nick Jones joined the meeting to present the Chicken Proposal.
- From the 4 original school chickens, there is only one left. Proposal is to always have 4 chickens on the grounds.
- Having chickens on the school grounds help the students in multiple areas such as their well-being, connection, developing a sense of responsibility, student collaboration, empathy, and respect towards animals.
- The chickens will need a new house which will include a concrete slab, roofing, wiring and a gate. Estimated costs are \$1,500 + slab + labour.
- The Sustainability Team have been asked to source quotes and the decision for funding will be made, based on these quotes.

3. LEARNING SUPPORT

- Mrs. Louise Seager, Mrs. Nicole Marshall and Mrs. Sarah Brown joined the meeting to present the Learning Support Program.
- The aim of the program is to provide a range of support to all students at WHPS to reach their full potential academically, socially, and emotionally.
- If a child requires extra support, the classroom teacher will work together with parents to build a plan of action which can be based around Literacy & Numeracy, Emotional & Social Behaviour and Health.
- Huge increase in children who need additional help mostly emotional and social because of the last two Covid years.
- Different programs available to help children such as Covid Intensive Learning Support Program, High Performance Gifted Education, Well-being Support such as Hub Club Lunch Club, Wellbeing Group, Beginning of the Year Transition Support.
- Parents can help too. There is a volunteer reading program where students come
 in and the volunteer reads letter sounds from a script to support the child's
 reading skills. This is a one-on-one program.
